THE POWER OF AN IDEA

Polishing the Pulpit began with three friends getting together to brainstorm sermon ideas. We soon invited other friends and someone said, "This is great! We should tell others."

We did and invited a speaker to discuss sermon preparation and give sample sermons. Interest increased; more speakers were invited. We moved to a hotel conference area. We dreamed big. "Let's invite the best speakers in the brotherhood and see who we can get." They came. Wives wanted in, so we added women's classes. While these great speakers were assembled in one place, we decided to offer classes for elders. They loved it. People began coming from all over the country.

Youth workers and deacons became interested. We added tracks for them. PTP moved to a large

event center in the Smoky Mountains. Attendance approached 1,000. Christians from other nations began coming.

"Why don't you have classes for regular members?" we were asked. So we added Spiritual Renewal Weekend, as well as tracks for members, teens, and children. Attendance passed 3,000.

That brings us to 2014. The largest PTP ever is in the works—189 speakers, 13 concurrent sessions each hour, and nearly 650 separate topics spread over seven days. Our attendance goal is 3,500.

What does God have in store for PTP now? Come and see!

He Being Dead Yet Speaks. Gus Nichols died in 1975, but his influence is still felt throughout North Alabama and beyond. Mark Posey's father worked with brother Nichols in the 1960s and has over 10,000 of his unpublished sermons. Mark has permission to make some of these available at PTP. Preachers, come and get it!

No Lines—Registration. This year, if you register online before August 1, your name tags will be mailed to you a few weeks before the event, and you will not need to stand in a registration line! Simply wear your name tag and go straight to class. Name tags need to be worn each day so PTP staff know that you are registered/paid.

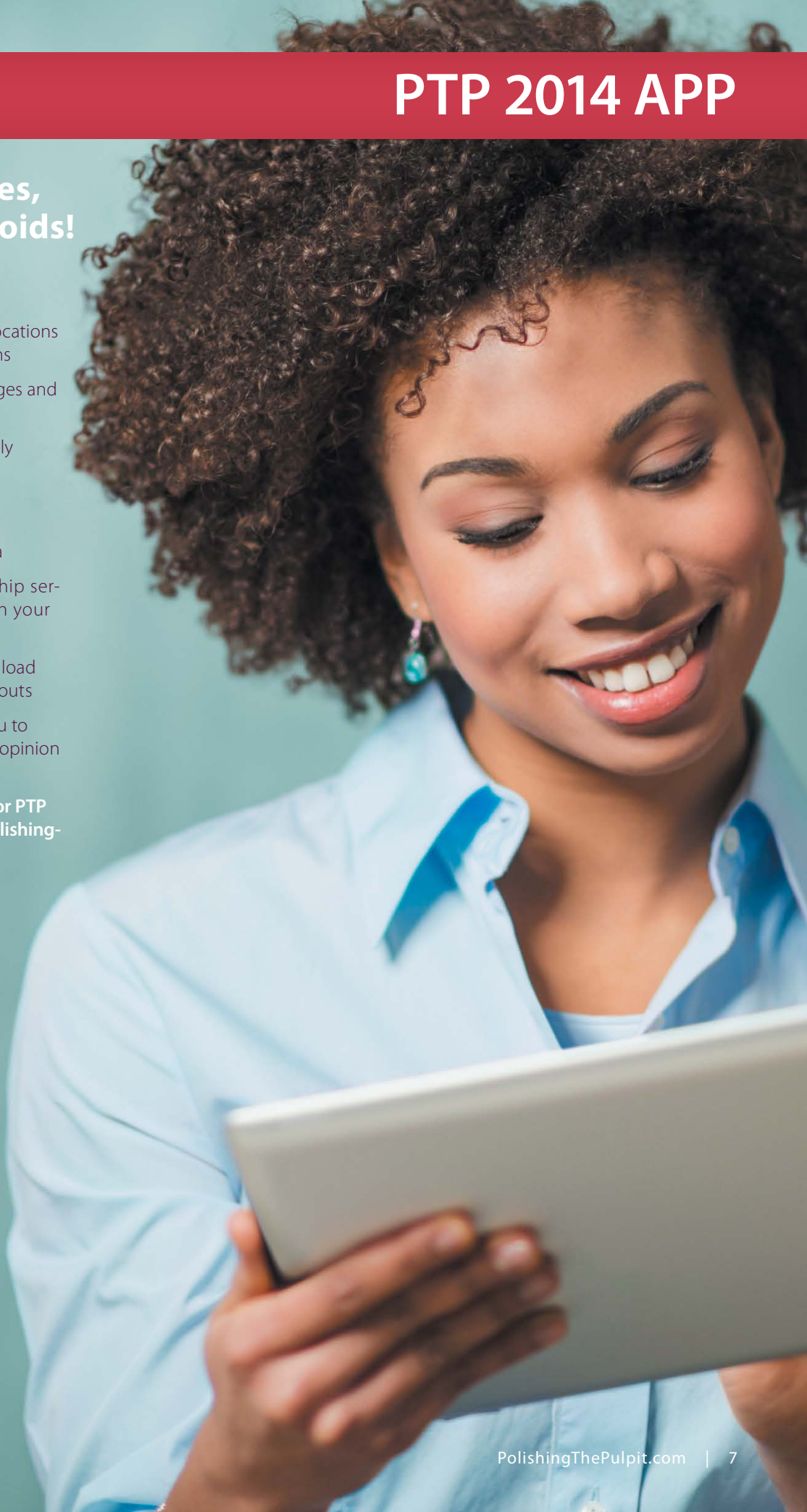

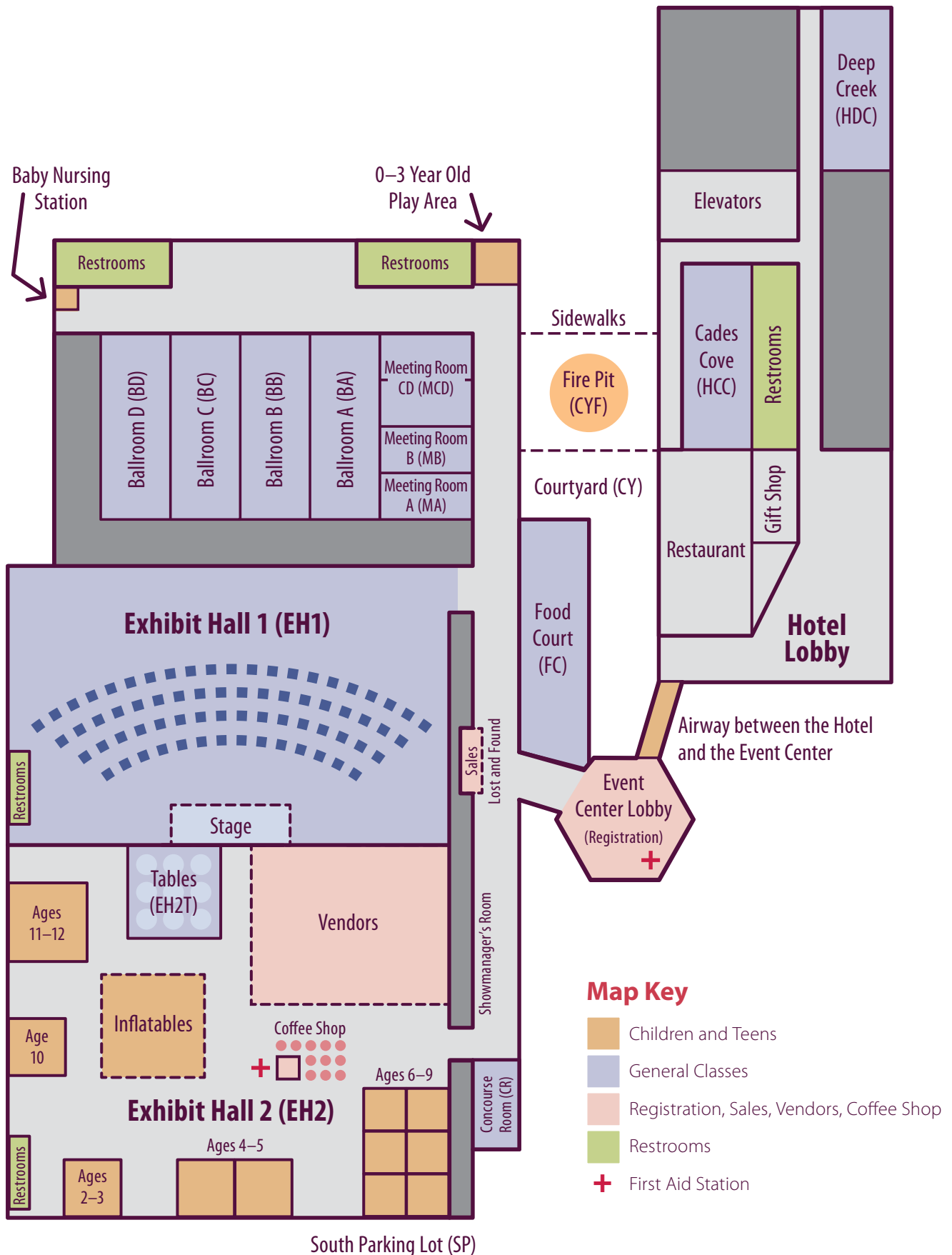

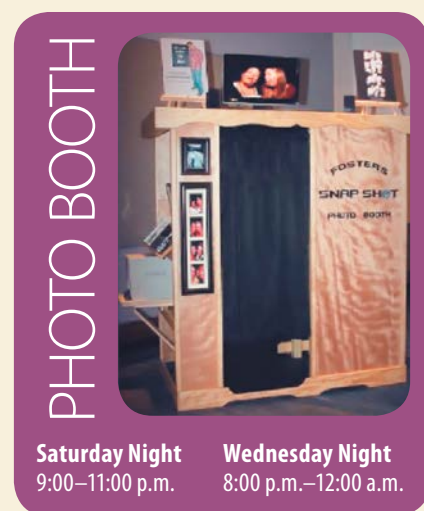

CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

Receive a PTP certificate by attending PTP classes! Successful participation for five years (32 hours of instruction per year) in the certificate program qualifies one for the PTP diploma. There is no additional charge.

The Process:

Step 1: Choose your track

Step 2: Sign up for the program by picking up your Certificate Form from Kelli at the registration table at the event.

Step 3:

- Attend 20 track classes and 12 elective classes.
- Mark which class you are in on the certificate form. (The class number corresponds with the class session in the schedule.)

Step 4:

At end of PTP, you must return your certificate form and sign the honor code statement at the bottom with the list of the classes your attended, and a statement that your notes are assembled in proper order. (You do not turn in your notebook of notes.)

Step 5:

Your certificate will be signed and mailed after PTP.



MISSIONARY RENDEZVOUS

Trappers in the American West gathered as early as 1832 for a two-week rendezvous at Pierre's Hole in the Rocky Mountains. Each year, Indian and mountain man camps extended along the west side of the Teton Mountains, covering an area of seven square miles. It is estimated there were 400 mountain men, 108 lodges of Nez Perce, 80 lodges of Flatheads, and over 3,000 horses.

The rendezvous served several purposes, including selling furs, resupplying for the coming season, and recreation, contests, and games. Most participants looked forward to it all year and had a good time swapping tall tales.



Missionaries, often alone in unfriendly territory, are the rugged mountain men of today's church. Like Pierre's Hole, PTP is a rendezvous in the mountains to recharge and resupply for the coming season. Instead of swapping tall tales, we swap sermons and ideas. Instead of playing games, we exchange information. Instead of selling furs, we enrich the soul through vibrant worship with more than 2,000 saints.

Ten nations were represented at last year's PTP. Just imagine if we could encourage all our missionaries to make PTP a part of their support trips and furloughs. Think how much it could help the kingdom to have elders and church members invite their missionary families to join them at PTP and pay their way to come. To meet with a larger gathering of saints than they ever see on the mission field and to hear soul-stirring messages will recharge their batteries and extend their mission service.

The expanded track has 20 sessions over seven days, not counting evangelism and preacher classes. Classes include:

- What Work in a Mission Field Involves
- Overcoming the Enormous Odds and Great Challenges of Mission Work
- Challenges Facing Mission Works (culture, worldly lifestyles, lack of leadership, reputation, too few workers, lack of funds, social issues, fatigued workers, separation from the home church, and resource shortages)
- Carrying the gospel to the Navajo Indians in Arizona as well as to people in Africa, India, New Zealand, the Pacific, and many others
- Working without Workers: How mission churches can work without elders, deacons, Bible teachers, song leaders, greeters, etc.
- Supporting a Missionary—More than money?
- Getting Tools into Worker's Hands
- I Didn't Even Know That Was a Mission Field
- Recharging Missionary Batteries. One missionary said after last year's PTP, "Believe me, there is no one who needs to be recharged more than our mission workers."

Meals: The Hidden Trail Grill and Events Center Food Court serve breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Rooms have microwaves, refrigerators, and coffeemakers. Most eat out with friends at area restaurants.

Snacks/Drinks: Available for purchase at hotel and Events Center.



Is registration required if I am only coming for one day? Yes, a day pass is available (\$100). Registration information is required even if you are coming on scholarship or if you plan only to attend a few sessions.

What is the usual dress for the sessions? Dress/casual. Most men wear ties or pullover shirts to the day/night sessions. Ladies wear dresses or pant suits. Suits and dresses are usual for worship services. The elders request conservative modesty rules be observed throughout PTP. Please no skirts above the knee, no shorts, and no tops that show cleavage. The rooms are often cool, so bring a sweater or jacket.

Is applause appropriate after speeches? No (but “amens” are encouraged!)

May I record the sessions? No, audio and video recording are not allowed.

Is transportation provided to off-site events? This is a friendly group, and many are driving vans with extra space, so let someone know if you need a ride.

Do you have to be a preacher or elder to attend? No. There are classes for all church members, deacons, youth workers, women, teens, and kids. Anyone is welcome to attend.

May ladies attend men’s sessions? Yes. While there are women’s classes throughout the day, women may attend men’s sessions.

May men attend ladies’ sessions? No. (1 Timothy 2:12–13).

Must I stay in one track? No, provided there is room, one may cross over tracks.

Will transportation be provided from the airport? No, there is no shuttle, but there are taxi service and car rental options.

What about the waterpark at the Wilderness Hotel? All of the directors and overseeing elders are strongly opposed to mixed swimming and are taking steps to avoid this being a distraction to our attendees. We asked the hotel to let us rent the entire facility and close the

waterpark. This was not possible, so we encourage all attendees NOT to use the waterpark because of the Bible’s teaching on modesty (1 Timothy 2:9), our responsibility to avoid being a stumbling block to others (Romans 14:13), and our need to avoid putting ourselves in the path of temptation (Matthew 5:28; 6:13).

Will child care be provided? Yes, during most of the women’s sessions. The charge is \$50 for the week (regardless of how many sessions you use it or how many children you have). Children must be potty-trained and between the ages of 2 and 6.

May I take my child under 2 into sessions? Yes. We ask that a parent take a child out **immediately** if he/she cries or makes noise. You will be able to listen to the lesson after the event with the digital copy you will receive on the final day.

There is **no convention-wide public announcement system**, so please accompany small children at all times.

What are the locations of exhibits, sessions, etc? PTP sessions will be held in two places: the Events Center Conference area and the Hotel Meeting rooms. These are within easy walking distance of each other. The locations for each track are listed in the schedule. (Note that the Events Center has both Ballrooms and Meeting Rooms.)

Is there anything for children and teens? We have a full slate of classes and activities for children, ages 2–18.

Is parking free? Yes, parking at the Events Center is included in your registration fee.

Do I have to stay at the Wilderness at the Smokies Hotel? We negotiate discounted prices for area hotels. Check lodging alternatives on page 48. Remember to mention PTP for your discounted rate.

May we arrive early or stay over? The hotel discount is good for two days before and after the event, so feel free to relax before or after PTP. Exhibitors can begin setting up at the Events Center at noon on Friday.

CAN'T AFFORD TO COME?

Can't Afford to Come?

We do not want anyone who needs a recharge to miss PTP because we charge for it. Some of the more discouraging works may be the very churches that cannot afford to send someone, so we've worked it out so one can come anyway.

Free Fee: Scholarships covering the workshop fee are available for many who cannot otherwise come. Fill out

Free Food: The Sevierville church provides lunch each day in their fellowship hall for those who need it. You would have food costs even at home, so bring some cereal for breakfast and sandwich fixings for dinner, and lunch is on us!

Why a Fee at All?

From the beginning, the preachers who put PTP together expressed a desire to the Jacksonville elders to help bear the cost of what was benefiting their local works. It has always been a cooperative work.

PTP differs from a revival or evangelistic service in that it is a cooperative work of many congregations in educating and edifying their leaders and teachers.

PTP is a workshop—a type of school. Its purpose is continuing education for preachers, elders, and other kingdom workers. Some churches establish schools to train preachers and then other congregations send their young men to study in those schools. They assist the overseeing congregation with the finances required to run the school.

This is what churches do with PTP. The Jacksonville church of Christ oversees the work, and other churches and individuals help bear the expense by covering the cost of sending their preachers, elders, and other members. If it is good to send a young man to a school for two or four years to begin his education, then it makes sense to send him a year later to PTP to continue his education.

Splitting the cost equally among those attending is also fair. The fee pays for the materials participants receive during the week (schedules, books, handouts, etc.), promotional costs, some of the meal costs and child care, equipment rental and conference space costs, and speakers' lodging and travel expenses.

No church or individual makes anything from PTP. In fact, the overseeing church, hosting churches, directors, and many individuals sacrifice a great deal to make up the shortfall each year.

We rejoice that this cooperation enables the brotherhood to have an event that otherwise would not be possible.

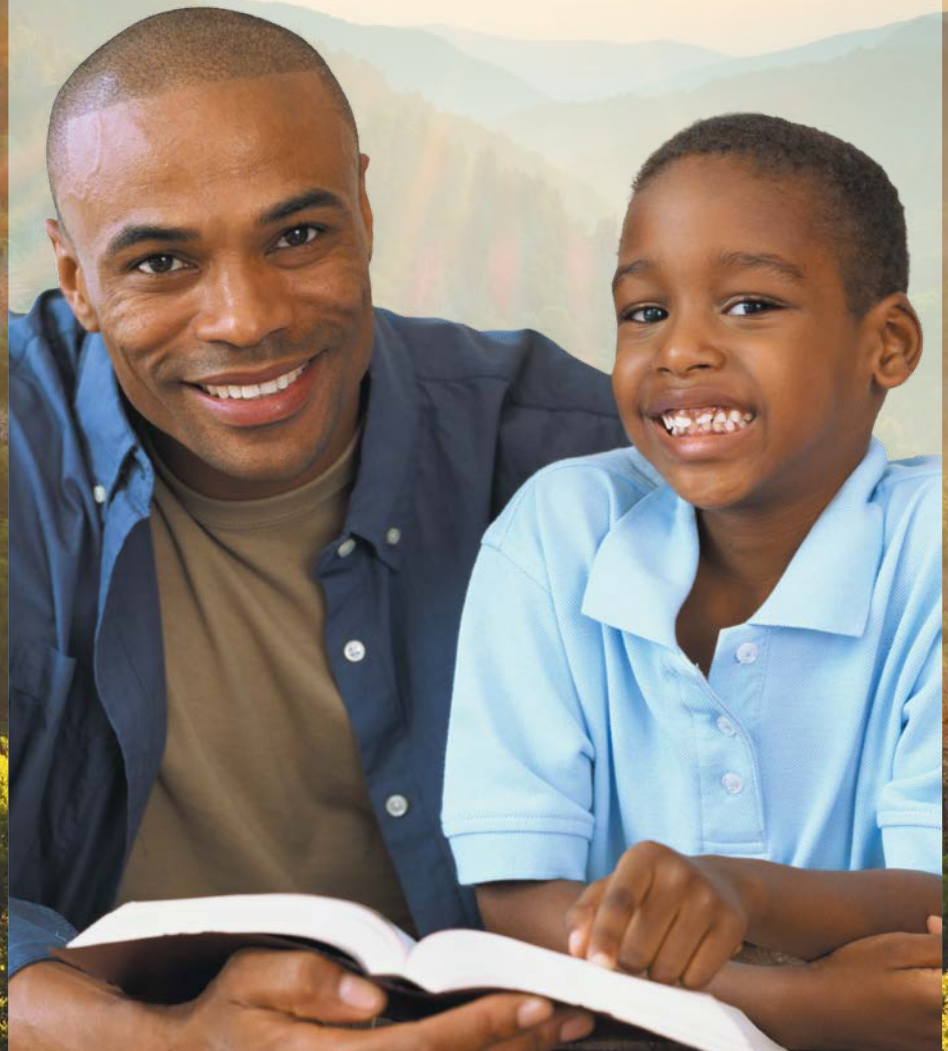
